2009-190 An Ordinance To Increase The Number Of Subclass 1 Liquor Licenses By One For Capitol City Lodge 1160 Elks D/B/A Capitol City Lodge 1160, 1800 E. Brown Street **(Requested By Ald. Dove) (Public Affairs And Safety)(Remains in Committee 4/20/09)**

2009-343 An Ordinance Authorizing Execution Of An Agreement To Extend Contract #CS07-05-37 Through July 31, 2010, With Lincoln Land FS, Inc., And Authorizing An Additional \$2,230,278.66 For A Total Not To Exceed \$8,921,114.66 For Purchase Of Automotive Fuel For Various Departments **(Requested By Ald. Lesko) (Public Affairs And Safety)**

This contract provides for the purchase of Regular & Premium Unleaded Gasoline, #1 Low Sulfur Diesel Fuel, #2 Low Sulfur Diesel Fuel, #2 Low Sulfur 2% Bio-Diesel Fuel, #2 Low Sulfur Diesel Fuel Dyed for Off-Road use for all departments that have City vehicles. The bidders provided a mark up for each grade of fuel for both Transport and Tank Wagon deliveries. Each week our price is determined by taking the low posted rack price for each type of fuel published by DTN Energy Services and adding the contractor's markup and all applicable taxes. It would not be advantageous for the city to rebid this contract due to the volatility in the fuel market. The contract includes a clause which allows us to extend the contract for an additional contract year annually upon mutual consent of both parties. This ordinance approves the extended contract period and the additional expenditure.

2009-344 An Ordinance Authorizing Execution Of An Agreement With The Springfield Center For Independent Living, Inc. For Implementation Of A \$55,000.00 Grant To Eliminate Architectural Barriers In The Residences Of Occupants With Disabilities For The Office Of Planning And Economic Development (**Requested By Ald. Lesko**) (**Public Affairs And Safety**)

The Springfield Center for Independent Living (SCIL) has taken the necessary steps for grant reimbursement for the installation of approximately four (4) wheelchair ramps and the modification of the interior of homeowner occupied units and rental units to improve accessibility to very low or extremely low income occupants with disabilities in accordance with the grant requirements.

2009-345 An Ordinance Authorizing Execution Of Subrecipient Agreement No. 08-SR-0007 With The Springfield Center For Independent Living, Inc. For The Removal Of Materials And Architectural Barriers That Restrict The Mobility And Accessibility Of Elderly Or Disabled Persons Utilizing The City's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds In An Amount Not To Exceed \$30,000.00 (**Requested By Ald. Lesko**) (**Public Affairs And Safety**)

Authorizes OPED to enter into Subrecipient Agreement 08-SR-0007 with SCIL for the modification of privately-owned housing units which are occupied by low-income persons with disabilities. SCIL will comply with the procurement standards of 24 CFR Part 84. The activity is CDBG eligible under 24 CFR 570.202(a)(1) and (b)(11), namely housing rehab which removes architectural barriers that restrict the accessibility of persons with severe disabilities. The activity meets HUD's broad national objective of benefit to low and moderate income persons under 24 CFR 570.208(a)(3), Housing Activities.

2009-346 A Resolution Authorizing The Office Of Planning And Economic Development To Prepare And The Mayor To Submit An Application For \$150,000.00 In Grant Funds To The Illinois Housing Development Authority For The Illinois Affordable Housing Trust Fund Program-Single Family Application-Home Modification Program For The Elderly And Disabled (**Requested By Ald. Lesko**) (**Public Affairs And Safety**)

The City intends to submit an application for \$150,000.00 in grant funds for IHDA's Illinois Affordable Housing Trust Fund Program-Single Family Application-Home Modification Program for the Elderly and Disabled. This enabling resolution authorizes the Mayor to submit an application for \$150,000.00 in grant funds to IL Housing Development Authority. The grant funds will reduce and prevent the premature or unnecessary institutionalization of senior citizens and persons with disabilities. Specifically, the IHDA funding will be used for home modification repairs and improvements owned or occupied by very low-income elderly persons and person with disabilities. The intent of the program is consistent with the 2005-2009 Consolidated Plan, priority #1 Affordable Housing.

2009-348 An Ordinance Amending Chapter 39 Of The 1988 City Of Springfield Code Of Ordinances, As Amended, Pertaining To Adjudication Hearings (**Requested By Ald. Lesko**) (**Public Affairs And Safety**)

This ordinance will amend Chapter 39 to make certain changes to the adjudication process to include: allowing the hearing officer to take judicial notice of all public records of the Sangamon County; amending the definition of “officer” to include a lake security office or CWLP security officer; setting forth a minimum period for hearings to be scheduled; clarifying when a default judgment may be entered; deleting the provision that limits the length of continuances; requiring that testimony at hearings be given under oath and eliminating remediation as a valid defense, as provided on attached Exhibit “A”.
