### **CITY COUNCIL SESSION**

Mayor Davlin called the Meeting to Order at 5:30 p.m. All were invited to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Clerk Tumulty called the roll of City Council members.

ABSENT: None

Mayor Davlin praised city employee, Paula Zink, a Housing Inspector with the Public Works Department. Last week she alerted a homeowner on South Walnut of the fire that had engulfed the back portion of the house. There were two small children, their mother and another individual who escaped the fire due to Ms. Zink’s quick action. Mayor Davlin thanked Ms. Zink again.

Mayor Davlin presented a proclamation to Rob & Michelle DeLong, owners of RMD Gallery and Framing Studio, for being model citizens in our community by giving students and individuals with disabilities the opportunity to create and display their artwork at the Gallery. A copy of the Proclamation is attached and incorporated into these minutes.

Mayor Davlin welcomed three international visitors from Russia, Georgia and the Ukraine who were in Springfield working with House and Senate leaders. Galyna Kornienko from Cherkassy, Ukraine. She is working with Senator Pamela Althoff. Yulia Zhuykova from Izhevsk, Russia. She is working jointly with the House, Senate, and the Legislative Information System (LIS). Kakha Abashidze from Tbilisi, Georgia: He is also working with the House, Senate, and LIS Yulia has particular interest in city government as she works in international relations for her home city. She presented a gift to Mayor Davlin from the Mayor of Izhevsk, Russia.

PRESENT ZONING CLASSIFICATION: R-2, Single Family And Duplex Residence District.

REQUESTED ZONING RELIEF: Reclassification To OFF, Office District Section 155.020, With A Conditional Permitted Use Pursuant To Section 155.020 (C) (7), Conditional Permitted Uses In The OFF Office District, Residential Uses, A Variance Of Section 155.111, Access To Off-Street Parking Facilities And Section 155.114 (B), Regulations For The Location Of Off-Street Parking Facilities And To Vary Section 155.097, Parking Requirements, An Office Building Requiring At Least One Accessory Parking Space For Each 200 Feet Of Floor Space.

Ald. Cahnman moved to continue the petition to May 18, 2010. Ald. Mahoney seconded. The motion carried 10/0. Ald. Edwards, Simpson, Kunz, Lesko, Cahnman, Mahoney, Cimarossa, Theilen, Dove & Griffin voted yes.

The Next Item On The Agenda Is Docket Number 2010-016 For The Property Located At #1 Mclean Lane.

PETITIONER(S): Connie J. Kennedy.

PRESENT ZONING CLASSIFICATION: R-2, Single Family & Duplex Residence District.

REQUESTED ZONING RELIEF: Variance Of Section 155.068, Garages Or Accessory Building Or Structures, To Allow A Garage To Be 9 Feet 4 Inches From The Side Yard Property Line Of A Corner Lot, Instead Of The Required 12 ½ Feet, And A Variance Of Section 155.069, Fences, To Allow A Privacy Fence To Be Within 9 Feet 4 Inches Of The Side Yard Property Line Of A Corner Lot Instead Of The 12 ½ Feet Required.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Approval.

PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION: Approval Of The Petition As Submitted.

Ald. Theilen moved to accept the Planning and Zoning Commission's recommendation. Ald. Kunz Seconded. The petitioner, Connie Kennedy, addressed the Council. She purchased the property in Sept of 2008. She stated that she had the property lines marked. She began construction of privacy fence. She moved the fence back five feet – even with the garage – as opposed to removing every other slat to afford visibility. The neighbor, Anita Young, had her property surveyed and it was determined that the markers were off approximately 18 inches to her advantage. Ms. Kennedy stated that she doesn't want to remove the 3 or 4 foot section of fence because it would not be in line with garage. The neighbor claims there are visibility issues however the street is only 2 blocks long and dead ends. Ms. Kennedy has purchased other properties and made significant improvements.

Ald. Theilen stated he had visited the property. He believes visibility is an issue. The fence is 6 feet high and creates a visibility obstruction. He stated we can both enforce the original ordinance and go back the full 12.5 feet removing every other board or remove 4.6 feet of fence. Ms. Kennedy stated she had a problem with Ald. Theilen's involvement in the case as he used to work with her neighbor, Anita Young. She feels there is a conflict of interest. She has cut back all of the bushes referenced even though they are on City property. She doesn't feel there is a visibility issue.

Mayor Davlin stated that Ms. Kennedy has a third option. She can request the petition be approved as submitted. Ms. Kennedy stated that is her preference.

Anita Young, 609 Rosehill, Springfield, addressed the Council. Ms. Young stated she isn't objecting to the fence as a whole. The issue is the 4.6 feet of fence on the easement. She has a sloped driveway and the fence is a visibility issue for her. She stated that Ms. Kennedy statements and the paperwork

submitted to the zoning board has been a lie. She was not trying to cause trouble. She believes Ms. Kennedy should be made to following the rules like everyone else. The fence is 30 inches off the City street.

Ald. Theilen stated he believes if the bushes are taken down and the fence is taken back 4 feet, the visibility issues are gone. Ms. Young stated she doesn't have a problem with that.

Ald. Theilen moved to amend the petition to allow a garage variance to be 30 inches from the property line (as opposed to the 12.5 feet required by the ordinance) and to allow the fence to be more than 3 inches off the ground and 6.8 feet the property line. Ald. Griffin seconded. It was noted that if the petitioner were to take the slats off the fence back 12.5 feet, she would not even need a variance. Ms. Kennedy stated she took the slats off the first section and she wants to leave the fence as is.

The motion to amend carried 9-1. Ald. Edwards, Simpson, Kunz, Cahnman, Mahoney, Cimarossa, Theilen, Dove & Griffin voted yes. Ald. Lesko voted no.

Ald. Edwards called the question.

Lori Williams, Traffic Engineer for the City of Springfield, addressed the Council. She stated it was her opinion that the bushes were a bigger sight obstruction than the fence. She drove both driveways and did not encounter a problem with visibility. Again, the bushes in full bloom were a visibility issue.

Mayor Davlin stated a no vote was for the petitioner and a yes vote was for the objector.

The motion, as amended, failed 2/8. Ald. Theilen and Griffin voted yes. Ald. Edwards, Simpson, Kunz, Lesko, Cahnman, Mahoney, Cimarossa and Dove voted no.

Ald Edwards moved to accept the Planning and Zoning Commission's recommendation. Ald. Kunz seconded. The motion carried 9/1. Ald. Edwards, Simpson, Kunz, Lesko, Cahnman, Mahoney, Cimarossa, Dove & Griffin voted yes. Ald. Theilen voted no.

PRESENT ZONING CLASSIFICATION: R-2 Single Family And Duplex Residence District.

REQUESTED ZONING RELIEF: Conditional Permitted Use Pursuant To Section 155.185, General Provisions And Section 155.187(B)(C), General Conditions To Allow A Sexual Predator To Reside Within 1000 Feet Of The Registered Address Of Another Sexual Predator.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Denial.

PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION IS: Approval Of The Petition As Submitted.

Ald. Cahnman moved to deny the petition as submitted. Ald. Mahoney seconded. The motion carried 10/0. Ald. Edwards, Simpson, Kunz, Lesko, Cahnman, Mahoney, Cimarossa, Theilen, Dove & Griffin voted yes.

### **REGULAR BUSINESS**

Treasurer Langfelder was recognized for the Monthly Treasurer's Report. He indicated the Corporate Fund balance at the end of March, 2010, was -\$6,394,891.00. Ald. Simpson moved to approve the Treasurer's Report. Ald. Cimarossa seconded. The motion carried 10/0 via voice vote.

Ald. Simpson moved, Ald. Cimarossa seconded, to dispense with the reading of the minutes and to approve the minutes of the April 6, 2010. The motion carried 10/0 via voice vote.

Ald. Simpson moved, Ald. Cimarossa Seconded, to incorporate the pre-council first reading of ordinances into the record of this council meeting. The motion carried 10/0 via voice vote.

The next matter on the agenda was the Consent Agenda. Ald. Simpson moved, Ald. Cimarossa seconded, to incorporate the pre-council reading of the consent agenda into the record of this council meeting. The motion carried 10/0 via voice vote.

Ald. Simpson Moved To Place The Consent Agenda On Final Passage. Ald. Cimarossa Seconded. Ald. Theilen asked if the money owed b Nehemiah Affordable Housing II, L.P, had been paid. Silas Johnson addressed the Council and stated the money had been paid. Prior to the start of the City Council meeting, Ald. Griffin advised City Clerk Tumulty that he would like to be recorded as voting no on Agenda No. 2010-146.

Ald. Cahnman moved to send Agenda No. 2010-148 back to the Committee of the Whole for further review. Ald. Dove Seconded. Ald. Cahnman stated the Oak Ridge Neighborhood Association had not had the opportunity to weigh in on the ordinance and he wanted to give them the opportunity. The motion carried 10/0 via voice vote.

Ald. Griffin asked for clarification on 2010-139. He asked if at some point the daily use goes over \$100,000 then that \$150,000 is due at that point. Tom Skelly stated if the overage occurs over three (3) successive days.
